#### Overview

You can download e-books through EBSCO on the Murray Library website! EBSCO e-books is a library collection of e-books from academic publishers. It currently contains approximately 125,000 e-books.

# View an EBSCO e-book online

- View in either html or pdf format
- Search through the book text
- Select a specific chapter to view online

#### Download an entire book

- An ebrary account is required.
- An Adobe account is required.
- Adobe Digital Editions software is required (only if downloaded to a laptop).
- A document with digital rights management file is created.
- Accessible on many computers and ereaders; it does not work with Kindle.
- Check-out period is typically 21 days, managed by Adobe Digital Editions.
- No concurrent user limit (unless set by the publisher). Others can still
  access and download the book through ebrary after you download the
  book.
- Not all books may be downloaded. This is determined by licensing agreements with individual publishers.

# Download ebook directly from EBSCO to your tablet/ipad

You must first have an EBSCO and Adobe accounts

#### **Create EBSCO account**

Through the web browser, go to EBSCO e-books database. Create an EBSCO account using the Sign In link in the upper right corner, and then selecting Create a New Account.

#### **Create Adobe Account**

Go to the Adobe website and create an account (the account is free). https://accounts.adobe.com

Note that in addition to basic account information, you will need to create a unique screenname (you can try firstlast name or combo of name with numbers). You will also be required to enter some demographic information about where you work.

# **Set up the BlueFire Reader App**

(Alternatively, you may set up the EBSCO ebooks app)

You will need the BlueFire Reader app to read the book after it is downloaded to your tablet/ipad. This is a free app available through the App Store. Download the app, sign in with your EBSCO account information and Adobe account information, as created above.

### Search for and download books from Messiah EBSCO collection to your tablet/ipad

- 1. Open the web browser.
- 2. Go to the library and search for books in either the library catalog or EBSCO e-book database. If in the library catalog, select the link in the library catalog record to take you to the EBSCO e-book database.
- 3. After you are in EBSCO, sign in with your EBSCO account through the sign in link in the upper right corner.
- 4. Search for and View the book you wish to download.
- 5. Select "Download this eBook (offline) link".
- 6. Select epub or pdf format. Select Checkout and Download button.
- 7. Select "Open In BlueFire Reader" when prompted.
- 8. The e-book will open in the BlueFire Reader app. You will be able to read the book until it expires at the end of the loan period.

Books expire from your reader when the loan period finishes (no overdue fines!), and you can always return books early.

## Download an Entire Book to your laptop (first time)

1. Download Adobe Digital Editions software to your computer.

**Please note:** Download Adobe Digital Editions to a personal computer only. Because this process involves downloading a software program to a computer with your account information, it is not feasible to download this software or ebooks to a public computer such as those in computer labs on campus. Instead, you must use a personal computer to do this.

Go to Adobe Digital Editions webpage, <a href="http://www.adobe.com/products/digitaleditions/">http://www.adobe.com/products/digitaleditions/</a>, and select the "Download" button. Select the appropriate download option based on your operating system.

- 2. Go through the Adobe Digital Editions SetUp Assistant Wizard
- 3. Create an Adobe account through the account link. Or sign in to an existing Adobe account if you already have one. You can also create an Adobe account through this direct link: <a href="https://accounts.adobe.com">https://accounts.adobe.com</a>
- 4. Sign in to Adobe Digital Editions, and Activate the software. This will authorize Adobe Digital Editions to run on your computer. You may authorize **up to six devices** at a time with your Adobe ID. (Adobe Digital Editions also works with many other ebook systems, so you may wish to use it for personal books through public library systems as well).
- 5. Select e-books on the library homepage. Select EBSCO e-books on the e-books page.
- 6. Create an account, or sign into EBSCO if you already have an account, using the Sign In link in the upper right corner.
- 7. Search for books relevant to your research topic. Locate and view e-book.
- 8. Select "Download This eBook (Offline)" link. Select **pdf format**. Select Checkout and Download button. When prompted, select Adobe Editions to open the file.
- 9. The book will open in the Adobe Digital Editions software. When you view the library of all books in ADE, a notification will appear on the front cover indicating the number of days you have left on the book loan before it is automatically returned.

# Download an Entire Book to your laptop (subsequent books)

The good news..... you've already done the hard part by downloading Adobe Digital Editions, creating an Adobe account, and creating an EBSCO account! You only need to do that once.

To download subsequent books, simply sign in to EBSCO, find and select your books, and download them. You will be prompted to open the book in Adobe Digital Editions, and you are done.

Please note that you will need to download e-books to a personal computer that already has your Adobe Digital Editions software downloaded and account activated. You cannot download e-books to a public computer in the campus computer labs.
